His association with top level bridge continues to the present day. He has been chairman of the English Bridge Union selection committee with the responsibility of selecting English international teams. He was also a board member of the EBU and has been the captain of many English teams in European and World Championships.

Most recently he represented England in the European Championships in Pau, France in June 2008 and in the inaugural Olympic World Mind Sports Games in Beijing in October 2008 (Quarter finalist). He successfully represented England in the 2010 Home Internationals (Camrose) following his success in the 2009 international trials.

Since 2010 Chris has been engaged by the European Bridge League and the World Bridge Federation as a member of the Appeals Committee for European and World Championships.

Locally, Chris is a regular player at Bath Bridge Club and in Wiltshire County bridge events.

1984 – 2003Flare Software Systems plc

Founded this software company in London in 1984 which became one of the leading providers of management software to Local Government in the UK. Flare relocated to Bath in 1989 and Chris remained chief executive and sole shareholder. The company was sold in 2005 to Civica plc by which time it was employing about 70 people.

Chris is now retired but retains business interests in commercial property in central Bath.

Personal Life

Married in 1971 to Maria-Luce Faina with whom he had 3 children, two of which are still living in or close to Bath. He was divorced from Maria-Luce in 1988 but remained friends until her untimely death in 2001. Chris is a grandfather to his eldest daughter's two children, born in 2004 and 2007.

Chris has two further children (now in their 20s) and was a foster carer for about 13 years, caring for nearly 40 infants during this time.

Chris was appointed a magistrate for the Bath and Wansdyke bench in April 2008.

Hobbies

Apart from top level bridge, Chris has several other interests.

The Theatre – Chris is an Associate member of the Theatre Royal in Bath and a very regular attendee generally on opening nights.

Music – Chris is a keen amateur musician and plays double bass with Bath Symphony Orchestra. He has an extensive knowledge of, and great love for, classical music.

Expedition Travel – Chris is an intrepid adventurer who has made several trips to the Arctic and Antarctic Regions including the South Pole and the North Pole (in 2008 by ski on an expedition led by David Hempleman-Adams). He has also crossed the Sahara desert in pursuit of an eclipse of the sun.

Chris is also an accomplished linguist, speaking Italian fluently as well as conversational German and French.

He is a well known local lecturer giving illustrated talks to schools, clubs and other organisations generally on the topics of the Arctic, Antarctic, Antarctic Wildlife (including penguins), Polar exploration and solar eclipses.
